Model Code on Education and Dignity

Our Model Code presents recommendations for schools, districts and legislators to reduce suspensions, expulsions and law enforcement in schools and implement positive approaches to discipline, like Restorative Practices and Positive Behavior Supports.

Solutions Not Suspensions

Our national campaign calls for a moratorium on out-of-school suspensions and the adoption of more constructive disciplinary policies.

Counselors Not Cops

Our national campaign aims to keep schools safe through peacebuilders, counselors and other school staff, and calls for the removal of all law enforcement stationed in schools with strict limits on when they can enter schools.

Federal Advocacy

Our work engages youth, parents and educators in advocating for federal policies that promote and fund solutions to school pushout.

National Week of Action

Our annual Week of Action raises awareness about the harsh disciplinary practices that push young people out of school and criminalize student behavior, and highlights the growing movement to transform school climates.

DSC Mission Statement

The Dignity in Schools Campaign (DSC) challenges the systemic problem of pushout in our nation's schools and works to dismantle the school-to-prison pipeline. We build power amongst parents, youth, organizers, advocates and educators to transform their own communities, support alternatives to a culture of zero-tolerance, punishment, criminalization and the dismantling of public schools, and fight racism and all forms of oppression.

WHAT IS SCHOOL PUSHOUT?

Every child has a right to a quality education and to be treated with dignity. Yet, the way our schools approach discipline often pushes young people out of schools through suspensions, expulsions and the involvement of law enforcement in schools. While these approaches negatively impact all students, students of color, students with disabilities and LGBTQ students are disproportionately affected. In fact, Black students are suspended at a rate three times greater than their white peers.

There is no evidence that punitive, zero-tolerance policies make schools safer, but there is an abundance of evidence that the harmful effects of these policies follow students for the rest of their lives.

Students who are repeatedly suspended are more likely to drop out of school and be pushed into the criminal justice system. The simple fact is that students cannot succeed in their education if they are not in school to learn.

“I was suspended for opening an entrance door at the school I attended. I was never given the chance to explain or defend myself. The suspension has really affected my studies, causing me to fall behind in my work, but that’s what a suspension does. And suspensions don’t get to the root of the problem.”
